Managing Relief: The Humanitarian System - Introduction into challenges and actors

Humanitarian needs mount - climate change effects, forced migration and violent conflicts threaten the lives of an increasing number of people. It is estimated that around 130 million people are affected by humanitarian crises, and millions more are at risk.

Bad experiences with humanitarian action in previous years called for an urgent transformational change to reshape the culture and approach of how the international community prevents and responds to crises. During the first Humanitarian Summit 2016 in Istanbul an „Agenda for Humanity“ was adapted.

Its aim is not only to meet humanitarian needs, but also to reduce needs, risks and vulnerability over time.

Besides this, humanitarian action should be “as local as possible and international as necessary”.

The seminar offers a wide range of expertise and perspectives on the issue of humanitarian action and Transition Assistance. It will include critical analyses and a discussion on challenges for a more effective and sustainable relief management. Participants get an overview over important actors and about the requirements for a professional career in that field.

Additionally, there will be some exercises, group work sessions and ice-breakers.

Students of all subjects/areas of study are invited to join in for a varied weekend with like-minded people from all over the world.
